Jewellery Quarter station was officially opened on Sunday 24 September 1995 by John Prescott MP (Shadow Transport Secretary) and passenger services started the following day. The station was opened as part of the Jewellery Line which saw the line from Birmingham Snow Hill to Smethwick Junction rebuilt to provide a cross city link via Snow Hill.

The line had closed on 6 March 1972 when the remaining local services from Birmingham Snow Hill to Wolverhampton Low Level and Birmingham Snow Hill to Langley Green were withdrawn. No station previously existed at this site - the closest being Hockley, a few hundred yards to the north-west.

On 31 August 1999, the Midland Metro line between Birmingham and Wolverhampton opened using the original trackbed from Birmingham Snow Hill to Priestfield, with two platforms adjoining the heavy rail platforms.
