Stourbridge Junction station opened in 1852 on the Oxford, Worcester and Wolverhampton Railway. Originally known as Stourbridge, the station was about 400 yards north of the current station near the junction between the Dudley and Old Hill lines. In 1879, the station was renamed Stourbridge Junction when a branch line was built to Stourbridge Town.

On 1 October 1901, a new station was opened at the current location, and the Stourbridge Town branch rerouted to serve the new station. The station consisted of two island platforms giving 4 platform faces. Platform 4, adjacent to the extensive goods yards, was taken out of use when the goods yards were converted into the large car park, enabling the station to be accessed directly from the car park. Plans about 10 years ago to reinstate platform 4 have not come to fruition.

The station booking office, built in 1901, was replaced by a modern structure in 1997. A new extension to the car park, opened in 2015, has increased the number of parking spaces to over 1,000.
