The Hawthorns station was officially opened on Sunday 24 September 1995 by John Prescott MP (Shadow Transport Secretary) and passenger services started the following day. The station was opened as part of the Jewellery Line which saw the line from Birmingham Snow Hill to Smethwick Junction rebuilt to provide a cross city link via Snow Hill.

The line had closed on 6 March 1972 when the remaining local services from Birmingham Snow Hill to Wolverhampton Low Level and Birmingham Snow Hill to Langley Green were withdrawn. No station previously existed at this site, although a station at Hawthorns Halt served football specials and was sited where the Wolverhampton and Stourbridge lines diverged, on the other side of Halfords Lane.

On 31 August 1999, the Midland Metro line between Birmingham and Wolverhampton opened using the original trackbed from Birmingham Snow Hill to Priestfield, with two platforms adjoining the heavy rail platforms.
