The first station at Shrub Hill was opened in 1850 and was jointly owned by the Oxford, Worcester and Wolverhampton Railway and the Midland Railway. Until 1852, the station was only used as a terminus for Midland Railway services from Birmingham.

Trains on the OWW commenced in 1852 towards Oxford and Stourbridge. Services to Malvern Wells started in 1859 with these services extended to Hereford in 1860.

The present station building was designed by Edward Wilson and built in 1865. The original train shed remained until it was removed in the 1930's.
